Belgian native Raphaelle Goethals and Wanxin Zhang, originally from China, explore the intersection of cultural identity in Biculturalism in Contemporary Art, a dialogue between Goethals' paintings and Zhang's sculptures. Goethals grew up immersed in the museums of Europe; the mediums and techniques used by Flemish painters infuse her atmospheric and dreamlike Abstract Expressionist compositions. Zhang juxtaposes Eastern and Western sculptural aesthetics in works that are often a commentary on social and political themes, particularly the impact of the Maoist regime on Chinese people and culture. The show opens Friday, Aug. 24, with a reception at 5 p.m.
